### 1 Ski Jumping Okurayama

Try a ski jumping simulator to know what it is like to speed down the ramp and launch yourself into the sky. With the display of your distance and score, it provides a virtual reality experience of competing in ski jumping. (\*only for elementary school children and older)

Enjoy dynamic videos portraying the history of the Winter Olympic Games and the beauty and drama of athletes competing on snow and ice.

### 3 Okurayama Ski Jump Stadium

The Okurayama Ski Jump Stadium has helped lay the foundation for the sport of ski jumping in Japan. Feel its appeal and relive the history of the stadium and its three major facelifts.

### 4 The History of Skiing

Skiing started in northern Europe and came to Japan during the Meiji era (1868 – 1912), from where it was introduced into Sapporo. Find out more about the history of skiing and how equipment has changed over the years based on real-life exhibits.



### 5 Timing the Takeoff

Experience the most important element of the sport of ski jumping – the timing of the takeoff. Challenge yourself on this exciting simulator.



### 6 Cross Country Skiing Race

Get a feel for the sport of cross country skiing, also known as the marathon on snow. Battle it out with friends or family to see who can finish first.



### 7 Japanese Olympians' Collection

Don't miss the rare opportunity to see up close the sports equipment actually used by Japanese athletes during the Olympic Games.

### 8 Ice Hockey Goaltender Simulator

This simulator lets you become a goaltender and experience what it is like to defend the goal by stopping the virtual reality puck shot by the player in the screen.

### 9 The History of Skating

Learn about the history of skating in Japan, believed to have its origins in Sapporo, and in the rest of the world.

### 10 Speed Skate Training

Try your hand at speed skating on the slideboard, a training tool used by speed skaters.

### 11 Bobsleigh Run

Use this simulator to experience how it feels to hurtle down a bobsleigh run by shifting your weight left and right as you ride to turn the curves.

### 12 Sports Information Zone

This section gives an outline of winter sports event rules and exhibits the equipment used in a range of events.

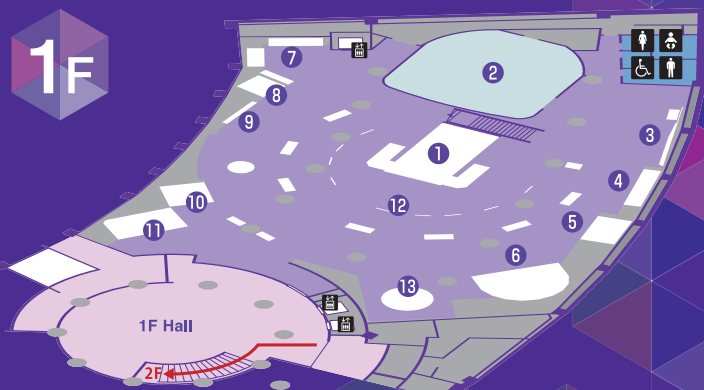
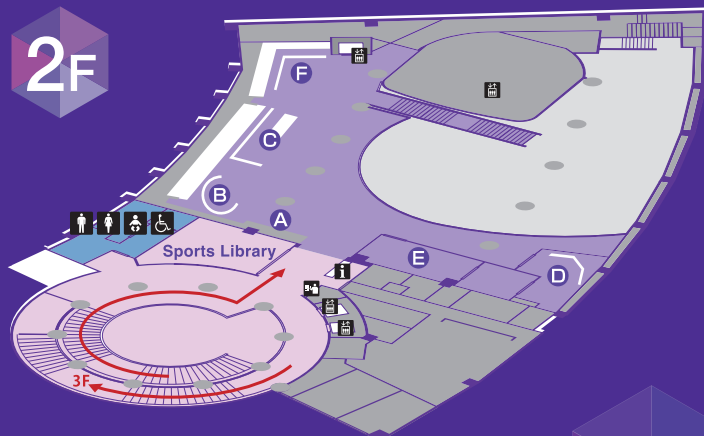
